

Open Flame

Be aware of fire safety regulations in your residence.

Personal Safety

At all times, you are responsible for your own safety and the safety of others. You are responsible for your own actions and the actions of others in your residence.

- Keep your door locked when you are not in your room
- Carry your keys with you at all times
- Keep blinds closed when appropriate
- Walk with a friend
- Do not admit people into your residence when you do not expect to escort them during the visit
- Report any suspicious visitors or activities to the Residence Advisor on duty

Pets

Pets are not permitted in residence halls. Keep your residence free of pets.

Quiet Hours

Residence halls are quiet zones. During quiet hours, you must keep your voice down and refrain from playing loud music or using electronic devices. Quiet hours are observed from 10:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. on weekdays and 12:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on weekends.

Weekdays 10:00 p.m. until 10:00 a.m. Weekends 12:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.

Residence Advisors/Residence Coordinators are available to assist you with any questions or concerns. During quiet hours, you must keep your voice down and refrain from playing loud music or using electronic devices. Quiet hours are observed from 10:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. on weekdays and 12:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on weekends.

Recyclables

All recyclables must be placed in the designated recycling bins. Do not place any other items in the recycling bins. Recycling bins are located in the residence halls.

Removal of University Property

Residence halls are the property of the University. You are responsible for the care and maintenance of the property. Do not remove any University property from the residence halls. If you find any University property, please report it to the Residence Advisor on duty.

Small Appliances

Small appliances are permitted in residence halls. However, certain small appliances are prohibited. Prohibited items include candles, incense and toasters. When in doubt, seek the advice of the Residence Advisor on duty.

Smoke-Free Residences

On 1/1/2014, the University of St. Thomas implemented a smoke-free policy on all campus residences. This policy was implemented to protect the health of all students and staff. The policy prohibits smoking in all campus residences, including dormitories, student centers, and faculty residences. The policy also prohibits smoking in all campus buildings, including classrooms, offices, and libraries. The policy is enforced by the University of St. Thomas Police Department.
